- 1) Anti Social Behaviour
- 2) Parking Problems
- 3) Speeding

**What's been Happening**

Neighbourhood Management Panel Meetings have produced some beneficial priorities for the area, Fishbourne have decided on, parking outside of Fishbourne Primary School at pick up and drop off times, speeding in Salthill road and supporting the proposed pelican crossing in Salthill road. Bosham set two priorities which are, parking outside of Bosham Primary School at pick up and drop off times and anti-social behaviour in Walton Lane. I will be acting on these priorities over the next few weeks by using a speed indication device and conducting extra patrol in specific areas. Any reports of anti social behaviour in Walton Lane and in and around Burns Shipyard should be reported to police on 0845 60 70 999. If you are a driver who picks up

children from Fishbourne, Bosham or Chidham school you can help to resolve the parking problems outside of schools by parking where the school suggests. The zig zag lines and single yellow lines are illegal to park on and is extremely dangerous for children who are crossing the roads.

The new Bosham Co-Op which was previously Bosham Farm Shop in Delling Lane has been subjected to two accounts of burglary and attempted burglary. Please be extra vigilant if you live near this area and again report any suspicious vehicles or activity. Alternatively anyone with information can contact Crime Stoppers anonymously on 0800 555111.

PC Rosier organised a bike marking event which took place in Bosham Primary School on Friday 6th March. Over thirty people brought their bicycles to the school to have them marked. It was great to see so many people show an enthusiasm for helping to protect their property. ## Crime Prevention ~ Bogus Callers

**Here's what you can do to keep yourself safe - and help others:**

When you hear someone at the door:

- Take your time - a genuine caller will wait.
- Look and see who is there, using the door viewer or a window.

If you do not recognise who it is:

- Apply your door chain or door bar.
- Check all your doors are locked - burglars often come in pairs, so one may come in the back why you're being distracted at the front door.

Always ask for identification, but remember:

- ID cards are easy to copy. If in doubt, ask them to wait and call their company to check - once again, a genuine caller will not mind.
- Use your phone book or utility bill to find the number - don't accept a mobile number offered to you by the caller.

You do not have to let people in and if you are uncertain then don't, however persuasive or plausible the caller is. It is better to turn a genuine caller away than let a burglar in.

If you look after someone who is elderly or vulnerable, please do all you can to make sure they heed this advice - and to persuade them not to keep large sums of money at home.

**Remember - call the police immediately if you become the victim of one of these burglars, or if you see anyone behaving suspiciously near where you live.**
