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Works Information Notice

Scheme:	New Puffin Crossing & footway work Chidham, Main Road
Start Date:	Week commencing Monday 5 th October 2009
Duration of Works:	Up to 6 weeks

Summary of Scheme

The scheme objective is to provide a crossing facility in Main Road for pedestrians at a point between Broad Road and Drift Lane. In addition, works will also be carried out on the footway. This work includes installation of tactile paving, which has parallel rows of raised, flat-topped blisters to assist the blind and partially sighted.

Duration

The scheme is currently scheduled to run for up to 6 weeks, however the duration of the work is dependent upon weather conditions.

Hours of work

Work will generally take place between 8.00 am and 5.00pm.

Traffic management

During the course of the works, two-way temporary traffic lights will be erected on site and will remain in place as necessary. Where possible, the signals will be erected each morning and taken down at the end of the day to allow rush hour traffic to pass freely through the area, although there may be occasions when they remain in place whilst an excavation is open or surfacing materials are hardening.
